
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## $\mathbf{PREFACE}$ .

This book is the fruit of many years of extended investigation and patient research. Those only who have engaged in similar pursuits can be aware of the untold labor required to collect and systematize the jambled materials for a volume like this. The driblets have been culled here and there from state, county, town, parish, church and family records, and from an extended correspondence with individuals who were intimately connected with particular branches of the family. To the many valued friends who have assisted in the enterprize grateful acknowledgments are tendered.

It is confidently felt that while unimportant inaccuracies may appear, the genealogy as a whole is perfectly reliable. This assertion is made in full view of the consideration that many persons who will peruse these pages have much better means of information concerning some families than can reasonably be expected from the writer. Those who are competent to detect blemishes will, it is hoped, make due allowance should they be found, while they remember it is much easier to find fault with the work than to do it better. It is well nigh impossible to produce a publication of this kind which shall be entirely free from imperfections. A certain author defines all history to be merely "an approximation towards truth." Without endorsing fully this humiliating statement, yet, when the imperfection of everything human is considered, it must be admitted the sentiment has some foundation in fact. There doubtless are omissions in the book though it includes, so far as could be obtained, every person of the name in its varied orthography throughout the United States. And there are probably some mistakes since it is impossible at this late day to prepare genealogical statistics with perfect accuracy. Honest George Dyer, a classical scholar and writer of the last generation whose long life of literary toil exemplified the extreme care he eulogizes, asks enthusiastically, "Who can calculate on the consequence of a single date, sometimes to an individual, sometimes to a family, and sometimes even

to the public ?" If under the circumstances, the depravity of figures has represented some individuals as born a century or two out of time, or forced them into incongruous marriages, or prematurely consigned them to the shades, they can console themselves with the reflection that they are at liberty still to live on as though no such mishap had occurred.

Very few such books will ever be written a second time; the pains are too great and the praise is too little. In the present instance however, the "years and years of dismal drudgery evidenced upon every page " has been a labor of love. The annalist designs the present issue only as the foundation of a volume yet more extended and complete to be put to press at some day in the near future. This will afford opportunity to correct any mistakes which may have inadvertently crept into the present text, and also for additions in the form of extended notices of distinguished members of the family, thereby greatly enhancing the interest and value of the forthcoming work. Massive materials of this kind are already on hand which can be arranged for the press in a comparatively short time if sufficient encouragement shall be afforded to warrant the undertaking. A manuscript is already completed containing the genealogy of Sir John Fitz of Fitz-ford, Devonshire County, England, embracing five generations in the 13th and 14th centuries. And there is little or no doubt that this is the ancient source of the family in America.

No apology is needed for such an undertaking as this; it justifies itself. It cannot but afford satisfaction to know that some of the old Puritan blood flows in our veins. Unquestionably they were the most remarkable body of men which the world has ever produced. To this noble ancestry we owe a deep debt of esteem and gratitude we can never fully repay.

"They that on glorious ancestors enlarge,

Prove their debt, instead of their discharge."

We may heed Cowper's caution and do something toward discharging our indebtedness by bringing from the treasures of the past and holding up to the view of the present and of coming generations, their example of private virtue and of public usefulness; their self-denying moderation in counsel and unsparing energy in action; and, above all, their childlike trust in God, and their implicit faith in the Gospel of Christ as the only sure foundation of Christian churches, schools and institutions.

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## The Family in the United States.

#### FIRST GENERATION.

The American ancestor of the family of FITTS or FITZ, was ROBERT, who, with his wife, GRACE D., was among the original settlers of Salisbury, Mass.

"At a Generall Court held at Boston, the 6th day of the 7th month, 1638, Mr. Bradstreet and associates are alowed (vpon their petition) to begin a plantation at Merrimack." In 1639, Winthrop says that another plantation was begun upon the north side of Merrimack, called Salisbury.

The record of land granted Robert Fitts is on page 21 of the early town records. "The first or original list of  $y^{\circ}$  townsmen of Salisbury in  $y^{\circ}$  booke of Records.

Rob. ffitts. [68 in all.]

This is a true copie as they were first listed in y<sup>e</sup> booke of Records. As attests ; Tho. Bradbury, rec'r."

The name "Robert Fitt, Planter," as he signed it, occurs in the Salisbury and the old Norfolk county records at subsequent dates as follows: 1640, October; 1642, March 5; 1649, February 3 and April 27; 1650, December 25; 1652, July 18; 1657, April 7 and April 14; 1662, July 2.

About this time he removed with his family to Ipswich, where we find him Jan. 5, 1663, and again Dec. 22, 1664. He died at Ipswich, May 9, 1665, leaving, says Savage, "a wife Grace and a son *Abraham*. [† 3.]"

His Will, dated at Ipswich, Jan. 5, 1663, was admitted to Probate, June 26, 1665. An inventory of his estate was returned Sept. 26, 1665, amounting to 230 £. 0 s. 4 d. It has been said that four hundred pounds was about the value of the largest estates in New England in 1661.

His widow was at Ipswich, June 17, and Oct. 9, 1667, and where she died April 25, 1684. She was probably a second wife, since Abraham calls her "mother-in-law." There are some indications that her maiden name was Townsend, since she "appoints her loving brother, Robert Tounsend of Ipswich, her attorney in a suit against Edward Gove." One of the wives of Robert Fitts may have been a Barnes, since his Will mentions "my brother, William Barnes."

Tradition says that previous to his going to Salisbury, Robert Fitts settled in Ipswich, to which plantation he came in 1635 from Fitz-ford, Tavistock, Devon county, England. He was a man of education, of high social position, and of Puritan integrity.

#### " Secundo die Septembris, 1635.

"Theis vnder uritten names are to be transported to St. Christopher's; imbarqued in the William and John,—Rowland Langram, Mr. have been examined by the Minister of Grauesend, and tooke the oaths of Alleg. and Suprem: die et  $A^{\circ}$  p'.

Robert Fitt, 18, [and others]."

Had he been in Virginia still earlier?

Petition, June, 1628.

"Robert Fitt, Anne his wife, and Alice Harris, a poor widow, to the Privy Council. Have been 14 years planters in Virginia, and lately brought over 16 hogsheads of tobacco, for which they have not the means to pay custom. Pray for a warrant for the free discharge of the tobacco, to enable them and their families to return to their plantations."

#### State Papers, Colonial Series.

I. 2. "RICHARD FITTS and SARA ORDWAY was marryed Octobar 6th, 1654."

He was a kinsman of Robert, and settled first in Ipswich, and afterward in Newbury. She is supposed to have been a sister of James Ordway, who was born in Wales about 1620, taxed in Dover in 1649, and about that time moved to Newbury.

"Att the Gen'rall Court holden att New Towne, May 6th, 1635, Wessacumcon is allowed by the court to be a plantacon \* \* \* hereafter to be called Newberry." The name of Richard Fitts is in the list of 91 grantees on the Proprietor's Book of Records. It also is found in town and county records, 1642, Dec. 7; 1655, June 30 and Sept. 24; 1859, Mar. 25; 1661, May 16.

Richard Fitts, called "planter," left no children. A son, however, of Samuel Symonds, Esq., town clerk, deputy governor, &c., who is supposed by some to have had for his first wife the daughter of Gov. Winthrop, was named after him, Richard Fitts Symonds.

"Richard Fitts dyed Decembar the 24, 1672. \* \* Sarah, y<sup>o</sup> wife of Richard Fitts, dyed April 24, 1667." His Will, dated Dec. 2, 1672, was presented for Probate, Mar. 25, 1673. Inventory returned Mar. 25, 1673—164 £. 18 s. 6 d. He appointed his "well beloved kinsman, Abraham Fitt," executor, and gave him all his lands and his personal estate.

#### SECOND GENERATION.

II. 1.-3. "ABRAHAM FFITTS was maried to SARAH TOMSON the (16th) day of May, 1655, by ye worshipfull m'r. Symon Bradstreet. She was the daughter of Mr. Simon Thompson, who was born about 1610, was in Ipswich 1636, made freeman 1641 or 1648, deeded land to Abraham Fitts 1658, and made his will and died 1676, appointing Abraham Fitts joint executor and heir.

After the death of his first wife, June 5, 1664, Mr. Fitts married the widow of Tyler Birdley, who was in Ipswich 1648. "ABBAHAM FITT &

REBECCA BIRDLY maryed the 7 of Jan. 1668." She survived him, and in 1679, deeded to her son, Andrew Birdley, all her right in the estate of her first husband, and died June 2, 1709.

Writings having the signature of "Abraham Fitts of Ipswich, Husbandman," bear the following dates: 1667, June 8; 1670, June 6; 1671, May 9; 1672, Feb. 27; 1676, July; 1678, Feb. 18; 1680, April 12; 1684. May 17; 1690, Jan. 16.

"Admitted to freedom and took oath accordingly. Abraham ffitt. Ipswich, Mass., Mar. 11, 1673-4."

1675, Nov. 30, with 28 other men from Ipswich, he was impressed for the Narraganset expedition of King Philip's war, in which, on Dec. 19, three Ipswich men were killed and twenty-two wounded. He was also with the expedition to Canada in the year 1690.

He died March 27, 1692. His Will, dated Feb. 24, was presented for Probate, March 29, and the inventory of his estate was returned April 6, all in the year 1692 Appraisement, 366 £. 10 s. ; debts, 98 £. 15 s.  $5\frac{1}{2}$  d.

III. 3.-5. ABRAHAM FITTS, JR., of Ipswich, married for his first wife MARGARET CHOAT, the daughter of Sargeant John and Anne Choat, the emigrant ancestors of that distinguished family in the United States. Her father, who was born 1624; and died Dec. 4, 1695, remembered her in his Will, dated 1691, and proved May 1, 1697. "Margaret, wife to Abraham Fitts, died Febr. 28, 1691-2."

#### Second Marriage:

"ABBAHAM FITTS was married to MARY Ross, Jan<sup>ur</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 9th, 1693, [1694]."

Writings between himself and others bear the dates, 1684, May 19; 1692, May 27; 1693, Dec. 1; 1694, April 9; 1697; 1704, Sept. 11. His Will was dated Aug. 4th, and approved Sept. 13, 1714. Subsequently instruments to and from his widow were given, 1714, Dec. 1, and 1720, July 14. "Aug<sup>t</sup> 16th. The wife of Abr<sup>a</sup> Fitts Dep<sup>d</sup> this Life, 1739."

"Ephraim Fitts died suddenly Jan. 13th, A. Dom<sup>1</sup>, 1742." 33. Ebenezer, b. Apr. 12, 1708.

#### THIRD GENERATION.

111. 3.-9. "RICHARD FITTS was married to SARAH THORNE, March y<sup>e</sup> 18th, 169<sup>4</sup>/<sub>2</sub>."

In 1691, Jan. 16, his father conveyed to him in fee all his lands in Salisbury, which included the original grant to his grandfather, Robert Fitts. He soon afterward moved to Salisbury, where he built a block house for his residence, and to shield his family from the Indians, by whom they were repeatedly attacked. It is a noteworthy circumstance that the same lands are now in possession of his descendants, having never gone out of the family name.

Bonds and conveyances between himself and others, bear the following dates: 1698, Oct. 29; 1700, Feb. 28; 1703, June 2; 1705, Sept. 5; 1709; 1715, Mar. 2; 1717, May 24, and June 14; 1718, Feb. 15, Mar. 9 and July 19; 1739, June 4. His Will was dated July 25, 1741, and admitted to Probate, Jan. 14, 1745. Inventory, Dec. 2, 1745. "Richard Fitts died Dec.  $3^4$ , 1744."

Mrs. Fitts was a superior woman, and remarkable for resolution of character, bravery and piety, walking sixteen miles to worship with the people of God at Ipswich, of which church she was a member. "She was a dutiful and affectionate wife, a kind mother, and a pious, charitable and useful member of society. She died March, 1773, aged 100 years."

IV. 9.-14. RICHARD FITTS of South Hampton, published Mar. 18th, married SARAH BROWN, Apr. 6, 1727. She was born Sept. 14, 1708, daughter of Ephraim and Lydia of Salisbury, a descendant of Henry Brown who came from England and settled in Salisbury about 1640. **Richard Fitts** entered into covenant with the Congregational West Church at Salisbury, Mass., Dec. 24, 1727. Sarah Fitts, his wife, united with the same church May 5, 1728. She died about 1754. He afterwards married DOROTHY EVANS of Salisbury, April 1757.

Mr. Fitts settled in what was afterward So. Hampton, N. H., then an uncultivated territory, infested by Indians and requiring in the settlers great energy and fortitude of character. On July 26, 1642, he with 28 others who had "done considerable towards building a meeting house at a place called Logging Plain," gave it to the town which had been incorporated May 27th, preceding. 1754, May 1, he deeded to his son Daniel, fifty acres of land in Kingston. 1756, Mar. 1, he was on a committee appointed by the town to survey a route for a highway. "Mr. Richard Fitts departed this life February the 23, 1791. His Will under date May 3, 1787, was admitted to Probate. Mar. 16, 1791. Inventory returned Apr. 2, 1791.

IV. 9.-16. "DANIEL FITTS and RUTH BROWN were joined in marriage covenant, P<sup>r</sup> me Joseph Parsons, Clerk." This was at Salisbury, Mass., Nov. 11, 1734. She was the sister of Sarah who married Richard Fitts the brother of Daniel, and was born 1712, and died June 3, 1788.

Daniel Fitts became celebrated in his trade of a blacksmith for which he served seven years at Ipswich,—" an uncommon good workman, a man of strong, discriminating mind and purpose, great mental energy and decision of character." He conveyed lands by deeds, 1759, Sept. 7; 1760, Feb. 23 and Mar. 3. His Will presented for Probate, Apr. 25, 1797, bears date Mar. 4, 1795. Inventory filed June 7, 1796; \$1,518.60. "Parson Croffis" of the West Parish attended his funeral. The following are the inscriptions upon tombstones at East Salisbury:

"In Memory of MRS. RUTH, wife of MR. DANIEL FITZ,

who died June 3rd, 1788,

in the 73 year of her age.

Life is uncertain, death is sure; Sin gives the wound, but Christ y<sup>e</sup> cure.

> In Memory of MR. DANIEL FITZ, who died

March 30, 1796,

in the 86th year of his age.

Here darkness dwells Fit contemplation for human thought."

There he married Dorothy Hall, and commenced business which he followed four or five years, and then removed to the adjoining town of Candia. Here he established himself in business, and by his industry and frugality, made himself wealthy, raised a family of ten children, lived highly respected both in church and state, and died at the age of seventy-two years."

She was born under the British crown, in Seekonk, Dec. 2, 1774, and died in the same place, April 29, 1861. From early childhood she was taught the truths of the Christian religion, which were of unspeakable comfort to her in after life. She in turn taught these same precious truths to her own children, and lived to see five of them, with their husbands and wives, and a number of her grand children, members of the same church with herself. Mrs. Fitts remembered the Sabbath, and reverenced the same tury, and no one was more constantly there, and no one more devout and happy. She loved the Sabbath school and flible class, and to extreme old age, was a teacher in the one, or a member of the other. She was a lover of good people; a friend to mission, and to all humane and benevolent institutions; and proved her friendship by her liberal contributions, and by the provisions of her Will.

Though her mind was partially impaired by great age so as to be forgetful of worldly things, yet, the mention of the truths of the Bible, the name of Jesus, or the voice of prayer, would call out such expressions of joy as to convince all her friends that her knowledge of spiritual things and her love of them, were as when in the vigor of life. Her excellency of character and uniform piety greatly-endeared her to the church and people with whom she worshiped, by whom she will be long held in affectionate remembrance. 'The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance.' She died as she lived, full of faith and of the Holy Ghost. Her end was peace.

Seekonk, June 2, 1861."

Here follows an obituary of Mr. Fitts.

"Died in Seekonk, May 18, 1846; Mr. David Fitts, son of Daniel and Christianna (Smith) Fitts, formerly of Ipswich, Mass., in his seventy-ninth year. For more than fifty years he was an inhabitant of Seekonk, where he sustained, by common consent, the reputation of a good neighbor, a good citizen, and an honest man. Mr. Fitts was a lower of the Sabbath, a constant attendant upon public worship, and, with a single exception, was present at the public services of the Annual Thanksgiving for more than fifty successive years. In infancy, he was dedicated to God by his parents in baptism, and, although the vows for their son lay long under the altar, yet they were not forgotten of God.

It is a singular fact, and often mentioned by the deceased with gratitude, that he had scarcely a day's sickness in all his life; and although he had nine children, no death had occurred in his family for more than half a century.

For some time past Mr. Fitts had indulged a hope of a glorious immortality through faith and grace. A short time before his death, he expressed his confidence and hope of a better world; and almost with his expiring breath, like Stephen, he committed his departing spirit into the hands of his Saviour saying, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.'"

The following appropriate lines are engraved on his monument :

"Weep not for me—'Tis unkindness to weep, The weary worn frame is but fallen asleep; It sleeps now in Jesus! How sweet his repose! No more of fatigue or enduranee it knows."

They settled in Ipswich, but about 1731 he sold his estate to his brother Abraham, and purchased a farm of Benjamin Marsh in Sutton, where he and his wife united with the Congregational church by letter in 1732. Conveyances of land between him and others took place in 1731, Dec. 7; 1737, Feb. 27, and Oct. 27; 1739, Jan. 27; 1748, Feb. 10, and Feb. 20; 1752, Dec. 22. The mark for his cattle is entered on the Ipswich records as follows: "Robert Fitts' mark of creatures is a hollow crop in y° off ear and half penny in y° same; a crop in y° near ear, a nick in y<sup>e</sup> under side y<sup>e</sup> same, and a hole in y<sup>e</sup> same ear." His Will signed and sealed, May 10, 1753, was presented for Probate, June 15, and allowed, Aug. 22, 1753. It is recorded at Worcester, in volume IV, page 218.

Mr. Fitts was about seven years of age when his father died, and he was put out till he was fourteen for his "vituals and clothes"; then bound to learn the trade of a carpenter till he was of age. His youthful lot was one of hardship and privation; he had only one pair of mittens till after he was twenty-one.
